MERCER COUNTY, NJ – Parents, grandparents, and guardians came to Mercer County Children's Medical Daycare's parent/teacher conference and had an opportunity to explore updated classrooms and speak with their children's medical and educational staff. The children's families also had the opportunity to speak with the center's specialty staff and address other issues of concern that impact the health and safety of families caring for medically compromised children.



"It really does take a village to protect children and their families," said Sue Viola, President of the facility. "New Jersey's urban communities, and the vulnerable children who live there, need comprehensive service programs to come alongside the State's child welfare reform efforts. Only by working together can we begin to make a difference."

Kat Williams, the center's Director of Social Services, said "It's important for parents and guardians to keep in close communication and build strong relationships with the medical and specialty providers who have daily contact with their children. Proactive parents can help make the difference in the future of their medically vulnerable child."



Mercer County Children's Medical Daycare was formed to assist New Jersey's child welfare reform effort and provide children with special medical needs, ages birth to 4 years, with a continuum of medical care that is prescribed by their doctors in a daycare environment. The program opened in July 2003 as the State's largest pediatric medical daycare program and has served over 170 children from the Trenton community.
